The artists display, sell and sometimes demonstrate their originally designed hand-made items which can include various types of jewelry, painted furniture, paintings, photography, candy, tapestries, apparel, bird decoys, nautical items, painted glass and more. Some of the local artists participating this year will be Fine Art by Robin Samiljan, Mixed Media collages by Ursina Amsler, Blown Glass by Jeff Mentuck, Handbags by Betty Ritt, Lampwork Bead Jewelry by Kiki Taron Kinney, Folk Art painting by Anna Igo, nautical giftware by Jesica Brackett, Journals by Paperdance and jewelry and accessories by Tracy Cassidy.
